-SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT: FRENCH, ICT & DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

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
YEAR 7 - FRENCH



SETTING UP OR JOINING GROUPS



FIRST AID UPDATE

As the weather turns colder, illnesses are on the rise. If your child(ren) needs a paracetamol during the school day, you will have already provided consent when completing their registration forms. We have a supply of paracetamol (tablet form) in the First Aid room, so we ask that you do not send this into school. We can administer this from 11am. If your child(ren) takes this in liquid form, we ask that you complete a Parental Agreement Form before sending anything in with them. Medicine MUST be handed into the school office to be administered under supervision, and NEVER kept in students bags. These forms can also be used for other medications, including prescription and over the counter.
