SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT: RE




YEAR 7 RE

They have all made a fantastic start to their year 7 journey and in lesson recently created some great freeze frames retelling the key parts of the story of Moses!








YEAR 8 RE

Maths - Sparx self-study

All of our students at Deer Park have made a great start to this year's self-study tasks on Sparx Maths, with at least 80% of students completing all of their tasks on time each week. Amazing!! As we come to the end of the Autumn term, we would like to share out top 5 tips for self-study success with parents and students:

Step 1 - Start early!!! Self-study goes live on Sparx at 2pm every Monday afternoon. Start your tasks on Monday or Tuesday evening, giving you plenty of time to get help if you get stuck and ensure you don't run out of time to get it finished.

Step 2 - You don't have to do it all at once. Year 7 and 8 students have 30 minutes, and Year 9 students have 45 minutes to complete each week. Once you start the tasks, Sparx will save your progress so you can do it in smaller blocks if you need to.

Step 3 - Come to Maths drop-in. If you need help, MIss Braiden and Mrs Stratton run Maths drop-in every Tuesday and Wednesday, Break 1, in rooms 117 and 118. Bring a snack, get help with your self-study and earn green and gold e-refs. If you are unable to attend a drop-in, please find your teacher for help at another time - for example, after your lesson, but definitely before the weekend.

Step 4 - Go to Homework Club in the LRC. Learning Mentors are happy to help with Sparx self-study Monday, Wednesday and Thursday after school until 4pm.

Step 5 - Don't leave it until the last minute!! Deadline for completion of Sparx is 5pm every Sunday, meaning you have 6 days to complete it. Please don't leave it until Sunday afternoon, as your teacher is unlikely to be available to help you over the weekend.
