SUBJECT SPOTLIGHT: ENGLISH



It's been a busy time in the English department this year but our focus still remains the same – Communication is our key to success – so how can we make our students the best communicators possible. Whether it's writing letters in year 7, speeches in year 8 or essays in year 9, we are always looking to see what we can do to help our students improve so they can apply their understanding to life beyond education.

YR 7 CURRENT LEARNING

Year 7s had a great first term at Deer Park where our focus was on improving their creative writing skills. Students thoroughly enjoyed reading 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman at the start of each lesson and are now enjoying the weird and wonderful tales of Anthony Horrowitz in their fortnightly LRC lessons.

After focusing on creating Epic Hero stories and Beowulf, this half term they are looking at 'The Tempest' by William Shakespeare and have been finding out the difference between 'thee', 'thou' and 'thy' as well as acting out some of the opening scenes. So far, they've taken to it really well and I can't wait to see what they can produce as their Shakespeare confidence improves!

YR 8 CURRENT LEARNING

Year 8s have gone from exploring the Romanticism period and learning about the Gothic and Sublime in the Autumn Term to getting their teeth stuck into the politics and persuasion of the Pigs on Animal Farm. So far they have thought about what they would do if they could create their own revolution in school and create their own school rules, like the pig's seven commandments when they drove Mr Jones (the farmer!) out.

Year 8s are going to be working towards writing their own persuasive, political speech to see who will be voted class captain and decide on the rules of the classroom (for one day only!).

YR 9 CURRENT LEARNING

From September, the year 9 focus has been heavily on Literature in preparation for the demands of the GCSE. The year 9s began the year with comparison poetry and engaged most with Wilfred Owen's war poems and John Agard's 'Lessons in History.'

The highlight of the year so far was seeing the engagement in their first modern play, 'DNA'. Students explored the concept of Machiavellian leadership and, now they all know the plot, are looking forward to a production by the year 9 Drama students this term!

For now, it's back to Shakespeare and exploring Othello – their final Shakespeare tragedy before they look at Macbeth in year 10 as their GCSE text. It's great to see students pulling across their knowledge from the plays they have looked at in year 7 and 8 to see common themes and to begin to feel more confident in picking out their own key quotes to explore.

every line




